Information on the share buyback

End of share buyback programme 2022–2024 and launch of new buyback programme

Geberit AG, Rapperswil-Jona, 21 June 2024

Geberit AG has concluded its share buyback programme, which was started in June 2022.

In total, 1,266,678 registered shares in the total amount of CHF 600 million – corresponding to 3.6% of the share capital currently entered in the Commercial Register – were repurchased. The share buyback was conducted via a separate trading line set up for the purpose of capital reduction, whereby Geberit AG will use the available capital band for cancellation of the repurchased shares.

As previously announced on 7 May 2024, Geberit AG will launch a new programme in the third quarter of 2024. Over a period of two years, registered shares amounting to a maximum value of CHF 300 million will be repurchased. The registered shares will again be repurchased via a second trading line on the SIX Swiss Exchange for the purpose of a capital reduction.
